# **SIAS Woodland rolls out “green” wheels**

*Campus group launches borrow-a-bike program for students and staff*

**June 8, 2011** – Mountain bicycles are now available for SIAS Woodland Campus students and staff heading out to off-campus appointments. The new “borrow-a-bike” initiative allows students and staff, who walk or take the bus to the campus daily, a convenient, economic and environmentally friendly way to keep medical and dental appointments and run other errands.

Instructor Lillis Lawrence, chairperson of SIAS Woodland’s Green Group, says, “Green is an action word. Woodland’s Borrow-a-Bike program supports transportation that is enjoyable, healthy, efficient, plus good for the environment.”

Four bikes are stored on campus and can be signed out through the student association office. A helmet and key for the bike lock can be borrowed against a student or employee card. The bikes were purchased with a grant from SIAS’s Campus Green Initiative 2010-2011 fund.

The idea was proposed at a fall meeting of the SIAS Woodland Campus Green Group, which includes students and staff. In addition to saving time and money and reducing environmental impacts, the initiative also promotes fitness. Other SIAS Woodland Green Group initiatives include Lug a Mug, which encourages SIAS Woodland customers to use their own beverage mugs, plastics recycling, Earth Week videos and environmental impact displays.

SIAS is Saskatchewan’s primary public institution for post-secondary technical education and skills training, recognized nationally and internationally for its expertise and innovation. More than 15,000 students were enrolled in SIAS programs in the most recent academic year; additionally, the organization drew almost 25,000 individual course registrations. Through program and course registrations, SIAS served almost 26,000 distinct students with programs that touch every sector of the economy. SIAS

operates campuses in Moose Jaw, Prince Albert, Regina and Saskatoon, and provides a number of courses and programs through distance education.
